ENTITLED

The Royal Court (Bar Administration) Order, 1993

THE ROYAL COURT, in exercise of all the powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:—

1. (a) The Bar Council shall have power to make Regulations binding upon all members of the Bar in relation to matters of professional conduct including those relating to discipline, etiquette, advertising, tariffs and charges, provided always that the Bar Council shall have no functions or powers in respect of those matters relating to discipline which are solely

the province of the Disciplinary Committee of the Bar and of the Royal Court.

- (b) No such Regulations shall have effect unless and until they have been approved by a Law Officer and sanctioned by the Bailiff.

2. This Order and any Regulations made thereunder shall be in addition to, and shall not derogate from, the duties of an Advocate whether arising by virtue of his or her having been sworn as an Advocate before the Royal Court or otherwise.

3. For the avoidance of doubt, this Order may at any time be repealed by further Order of the Royal Court, but without prejudice to anything done by virtue of this Order and any Regulations made thereunder.

4. In this Order "the Bar Council" means the Council constituted by resolution of the Bar dated the 25th June 1993.

5. This Order may be cited as the Royal Court (Bar Administration) Order, 1993.

6. This Order shall come into force on the 1st December 1993.
